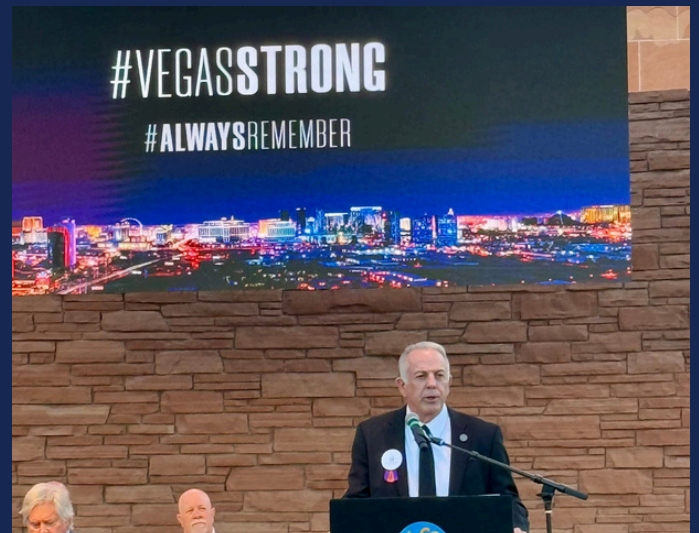
Dear Friends and Neighbors,

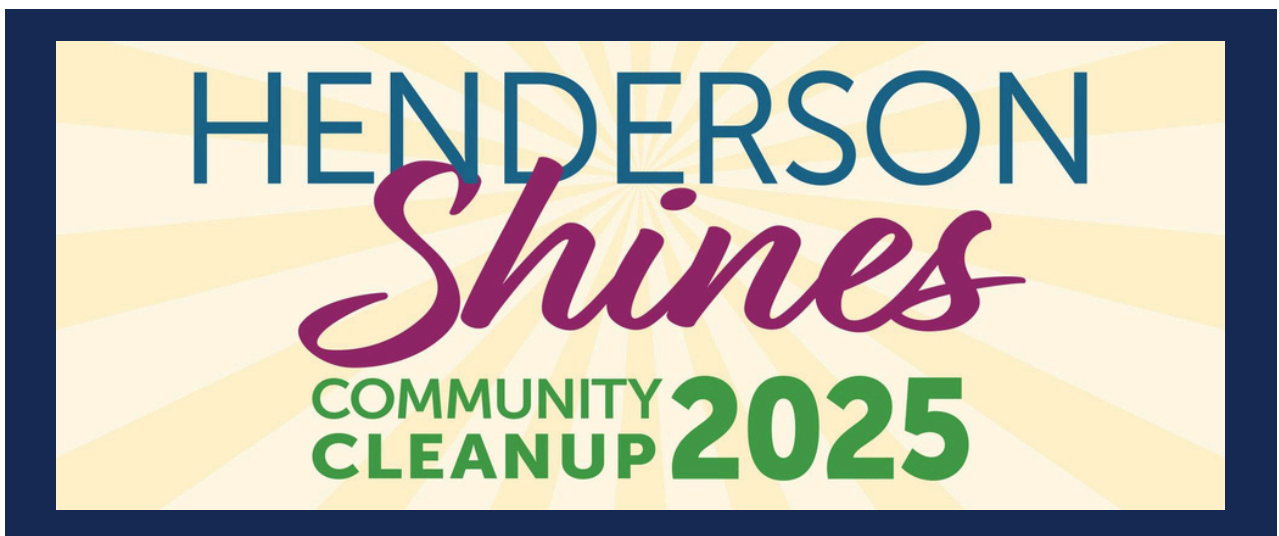
Upcoming Events

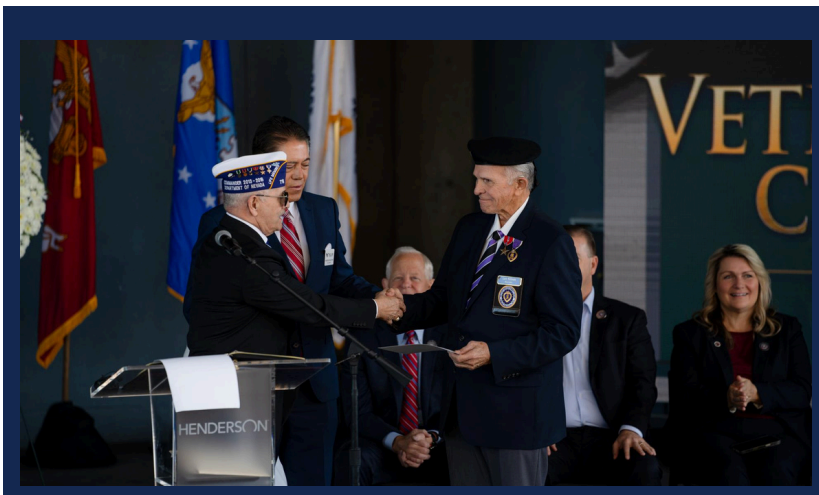
Free Cat & Dog Adoptions
