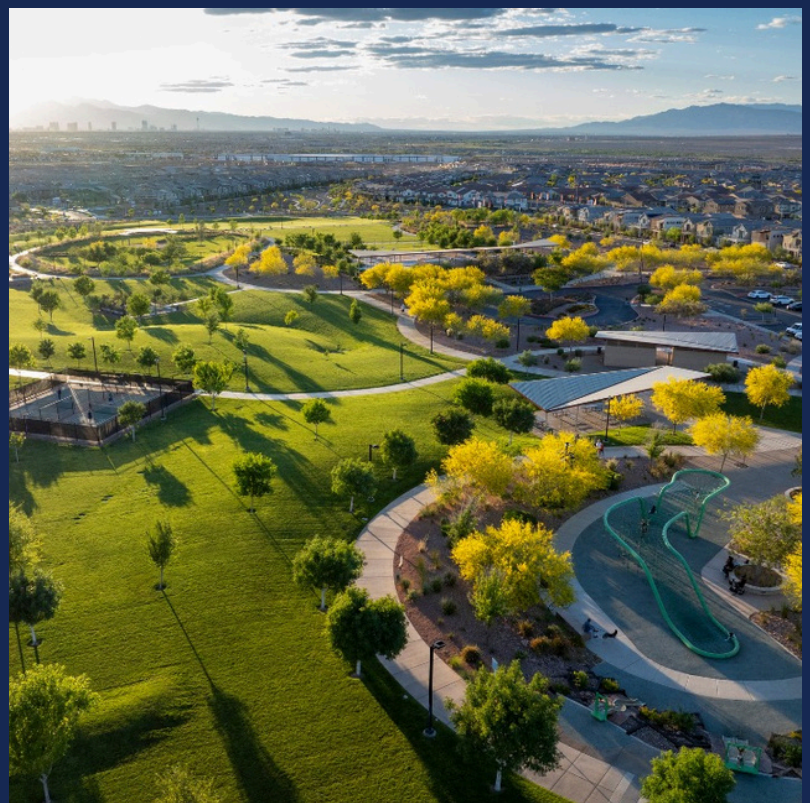
Dear Friends and Neighbors,

In the upcoming June 2026 Primary Election, Henderson residents will decide whether to renew the existing 12-cent per \$100 of assessed value property tax that funds our parks, recreation programs and community services. This is not a new tax. Residents already pay it today. The average homeowner spends \$120/year currently and this would stay the same.

Your “yes” vote renews funding that covers about 40% of the Parks and Recreation Department’s budget—your 12 cents per \$100 of assessed value stays in Henderson to fund local parks and recreation. Please join me and my family in voting yes on Question 1.
