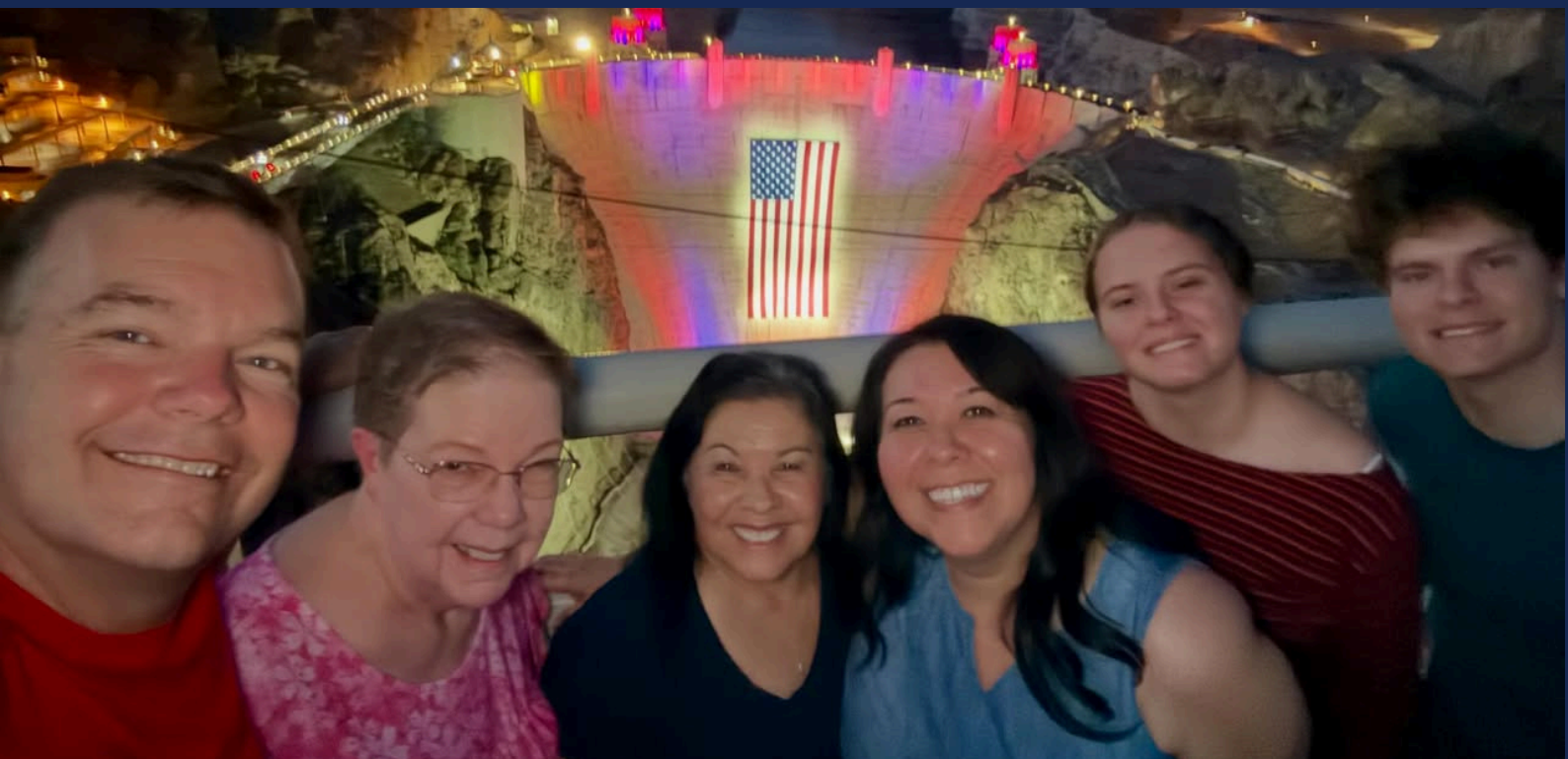
Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Fourth of July Celebration



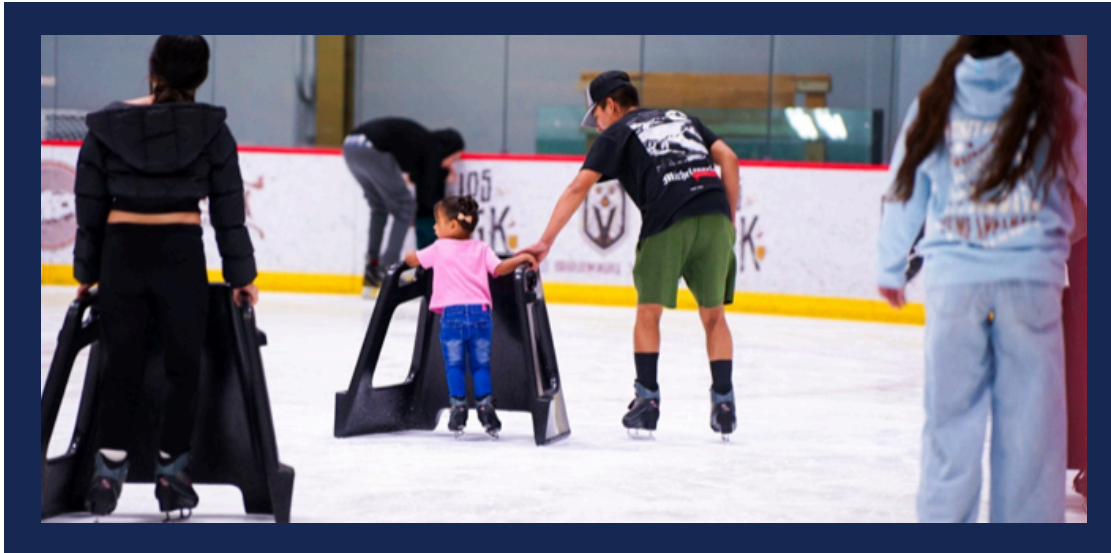
